Program Purpose



- Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century (MAP-21)
 - Consolidated Section 5317 New Freedom program into the "traditional" 5310 program
 - Expanded the eligible use of grant funds
 - "Traditional" = Capital (vehicles/rolling stock) ~ 55%
 - Capital projects meeting the specific needs of seniors and individuals with disabilities when public transportation is insufficient, unavailable or inappropriate.
 - "Other" = Operating (service) ~ 45%
 - Traditional capital projects plus additional public transportation projects that exceed the ADA minimum requirement, improve access to fixed route service or provide transportation alternatives.



Program Purpose, con't.



- FTA Section 5310 Grant program
 - Enhance mobility for seniors and persons with disabilities beyond requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).
 - Available funding for projects exceeding \$50,000

Eligible Applicants



- Private non-profit organizations
- State or local governmental authority
 - Approved by the state to coordinate services for seniors & individuals with disabilities

OR

- Certifies there are no nonprofits readily available in the area to provide proposed service
- Operator of public transportation



Eligible Activities



- "Traditional" Capital 55%↑
 - Rolling stock (vans)
 - Non-Rolling stock (computer software)
 - Mobility Management & Coordination Programs
- Eligible Subrecipient
 - Private non-profit OR state or local government entity
- 20% match versus 50% for operating projects



Eligible Activities, con't.



"Other" Operating – 45%

- Public transportation projects that:
 - Exceed the ADA minimum requirements
 - Improve access to fixed-route service and decrease reliance by individuals with disabilities on ADA complementary paratransit service
 - Provide alternatives to public transportation that assist seniors and individuals with disabilities with transportation needs

Eligible Subrecipient

- Private non-profit, state or local government entity OR an operator of public transportation
- 50% match versus 20% for capital projects



Funding Priorities



Must support goals/strategic objectives in CTP

Strategies/Priorities

- 1. Expansion of Volunteer Driver Program.
- 2. Increase Funding for Washoe Senior Ride Program.
- 3. Purchase Wheelchair Accessible Vehicles for Human Service Agencies.
- 4. Provide Flexible Transit Service in Outlying Areas of Our Community.
- 5. Coordinate Transportation Resources with Social Service Agencies.
- 6. Increase Funding for RTC's Non-Urbanized Transportation Program.
- 7. Creation of a Private Non-Profit Transportation Provider.
- 8. Provide more Travel Training.

Project Eligibility



- New or expand/enhance existing program or service.
 - Funds cannot be used to supplant existing funding
- Project expenses must exceed \$50,000
- Derived from/included in CTP
- Applicants must have
 - management oversight
 - control over purchased equipment
- Active non-profit status must be provided
- Projects must be ready to proceed



Vehicle Eligibility



- Must be used for elderly age 60[↑]/individuals with disabilities
- ADA accessible lifts, ramps & securement systems
- Procured through RTC
 - State of Nevada contract/approved list vendors
- RTC holds title
- Certificate of Insurance required
- Driving training program/policy required
 - Identify frequency, type & who will be trained
 - Safety, Substance Abuse Awareness, Passenger Sensitivity & Customer Service
- Comprehensive Maintenance Plan required (template)
- Replacement vehicles
 - Meet or exceed useful life
 - Be in active service during normal days/hours operation

Service Eligibility



- Document that project will:
 - Serve additional persons or trips
 - Expand the service area or hours
 - Increase the number or frequency of trips
- Ability to explain:
 - Service growth
 - Basis for trip projections

Project Evaluation/Scoring



- Steering Committee
 - Led by RTC staff
 - Advisory/non-voting role
 - Initial application review
 - Ensure compliance with federal criteria
 - Assure projects derived from CTP
 - Includes representatives Reno, Sparks, Washoe
 County, senior citizens, persons with disabilities
 - Committee recommends selected projects to RTC Board for approval



Project Evaluation/Scoring, con't.



COORDINATION, PARTNERSHIP & OUTREACH (maximum of 20 points)

- coordination among various entities
- project involves the private sector

NEEDS & BENEFITS (maximum of 50 points)

- meets a regional transportation need
- responds to the federal evaluation criteria
- demonstrates a new or innovative idea that cannot be replicated elsewhere in the region
- number of seniors, persons with disabilities and/or those with limited incomes served/benefit
- number of trips provided

PROJECT READINESS (maximum of 30 points)

- Overall cost-effectiveness
- Identifying reasonable strategies for on-going funding
- Project feasibility
- Ability to meet/comply with federal reporting requirements

Application



- Available on <u>www.rtcwashoe.com</u>
- Fillable WORD document
 - Expandable fields
- Helpful tips:
 - Concise narratives are best
 - Directly address the question
 - No points for partial answers
 - Don't leave any blanks
 - If N/A, explain
 - Don't use "to be determined"
 - Don't use ranges (e.g. 20-60 miles)

Program Requirements



- Applications are due April 1, 2016 by 5:00 PM
 - Full executed/signed
 - Mailed, faxed, hand-delivered or emailed
- Approved projects
 - Standard agreements entered into with RTC
 - Monthly, quarterly, annual progress reports required
 - Periodic inspection/site visits
 - Funding up to 3 years
- Comply with applicable state/federal requirements
- Sign FTA's "Certifications & Assurances" at time of contract execution
- Throughout the project
 - Maintain proper use of equipment
 - Cover Operating costs
 - Cover Maintenance costs



FTA Compliance



- Title VI (template)
- Equal Employment Opportunity
- Procurement –Competitive Purchases, Buy America, Disbarment and Suspensions, Davis Bacon – covered through State contract
- Americans with Disabilities Act
- Disadvantage Business Enterprise
- Drug and Alcohol, not applicable but must comply with CDL requirements
