ITEM 1. ROLLCALL/CALL TO ORDER

The Citizens Multimodal Advisory Committee (CMAC) meeting was conducted as a Zoom Webinar. The meeting was called to order at 5:32 p.m. by the Chair, Jeff Bonano.

ITEM 3. PUBLIC COMMENT

ITEM 4. ELECTION OF CHAIR AND VICE-CHAIR FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023

Chair Jeff Bonano explained the roles for the Chair and Vice Chair and asked for nominations. Lindsey Costello was elected for Chair and Ann Silver for Vice Chair.

The committee motion carried unanimously.

ITEM 6. ACKNOWLEDGE RECEIPT OF A PRESENTATION ON THE MCCARRAN BOULEVARD CORRIDOR STUDY

Dan Doenges, RTC Director of Planning gave a presentation on the McCarran Boulevard Corridor Study. RTC is in partnership with NDOT for improvements on the McCarran loop. The virtual public meeting was in March 2022, and data was collected for draft recommendations. He discussed the study limits and survey questions.

Sue-Ting asked how finalized is the study. Dan Doenges, RTC Director of Planning, stated a preliminary draft report for comment is underway and further recommendations for approval with the RTC Board and NDOT. There will be other opportunities for the public involvement.

Ann Silver, Vice Chair left the meeting at 5:58.

Damien Cole, public had comments on the corridor study and disagreed with bike riding next to the road on McCarran Boulevard. He commented on residential areas to the commercial areas and requested they have a separated bike lane. He commented that congestion will go down if a separated bike lane is implemented.

Dan Doenges, RTC Director of Planning, stated the study is looking at addition to the existing bike lanes for updates and improvements.

Jeff Bonano made a motion to acknowledge receipt of a presentation on the McCarran Boulevard corridor study.

Greg Newman seconded.

The motion carried unanimously.

ITEM 7. PROVIDE FEEDBACK AND ACKNOWLEDGE RECEIPT OF A REPORT ON TRANSIT OPTIMIZATION PLANS STRATEGIES (TOPS) RECOMMENDATIONS AND THE PROPOSED SEPTEMBER RTC RIDE SERVICE CHANGES

Michael Dulude, RTC Senior Transit Operations Planner gave a presentation on the TOPS and the September service changes.

Greg Newman asked on the disapproval ratings of the slides on his presentation. Michael Dulude, RTC Transit Operations Planner, stated at 30 to 40 percent of disapproval RTC will review the routes.

Damien Cole, public takes the bus as his primary transportation and he stated RTC RIDE Route 12 is being utilized because the RTC RIDE Route 19 has not been available for a year. Michael Dulude, RTC Senior Transit Operations Planner, stated ridership data was taken and reviewed over the last 10 years and there has only been one rider a day on RTC RIDE Route 19.

Jeff Bonano made a motion to provide feedback and acknowledge receipt of a report on Transit Optimization Plans (TOPS) recommendations and the proposed September RTC RIDE service changes.

Paul Hewen seconded.

The motion carried unanimously.
