The Citizens Multimodal Advisory Committee (CMAC) was conducted as a Hybrid Meeting. The meeting was called to order at 5:36 p.m. by the Chair, Jillian Keller.

ITEM 1. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

The agenda was approved as submitted.

ITEM 2. PUBLIC COMMENT

There were no public comments.

Ben Miller entered the meeting at 5:38 pm.

ITEM 3. ACKNOWLEDGE RECEIPT OF A PRESENTATION REGARDING THE POTENTIAL RENAMING OF THE COLD SPRINGS AND BORDERTOWN INTERCHANGES ON US 395

Alex Wolfson, NDOT gave a presentation on the potential renaming of the Cold Springs and Bordertown interchanges on US 395.

Paul Malikowski gave comments on the highway typeface for all the signage on the highway. Alex stated the standard upgrades will replace all signs within a repaving project limits during resurfacing. Ann Silver commented the residents are critical in the potential renaming process for feedback.

Dale Keller, RTC Engineering Manager gave a presentation on the 7th Edition Regional Road Impact Fee (RRIF) General Administrative Manual (GAM) including the RRIF Capital Improvement Plan (CIP).

Ann Silver asked of the resistance from the City of Reno, City of Sparks councils, County commissioners and planning commissions. Dale Keller, RTC Engineering Manager stated meetings have been in place with each of the councils and commissioners, commissions for the 7th Edition RRIF GAM including the RRIF CIP. Mathew Boog asked if there is a possible use of funds for multimodal trips. Dale Keller, RTC Engineering Manager stated it is a consideration for the capital improvement plan to cover the RRIF fees. Paul Malikowski asked of the RRIF capital improvements or maintenance how its accounted for. Dale Keller, RTC Engineering Manager stated RRIF is strictly for capacity driven needs and funds local state fuel tax for maintenance needs. There was a discussion on alternate fuel funding sources.

ITEM 5. ACKNOWLEDGE RECEIPT OF REPORT ON CENTER STREET MULTIMODAL IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT UPDATE

Maria Paz Fernandez, RTC Engineering Project Manager gave a presentation on the report on Center Street Multimodal Improvements Project update.

Ann Silver asked of the demand on Virginia Street. Maria Paz Fernandez, RTC Engineering Project Manager stated it is not a demand but a vision of the downtown Reno. There was a discussion on the Center Street and Virginia Street demand and the update which, operates at acceptable levels. Laura Azzam gave comments on the two-foot bumpers with events and pedestrians walking and tents it is difficult and dangerous with rounded curbs that blend with the sidewalk. Maria stated everything is being looked at for the vision on downtown Virginia Street when closed for events and she stated the rolled curb is between bike lane and travel lanes only, not for the pedestrians. The counts are being looked at closely and will be updated this month. Paul Malikowski stated on special events if there are conflicts and the Center Street bike route was approved before for the multimodal improvements. Maria stated the project is being analyzed with Virginia Street closed during HAN and the counts which, the level of service were acceptable. A discussion on special events and Center Street and the Placemaking study with the RTC and the City of Reno continued.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

While the transit industry has been experiencing a national shortage of drivers for many years, this shortage has become more extreme primarily due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Various reasons for the shortage in labor include:

- Job openings in the Transportation, Warehousing, and Utilities sector are at an all-time high and have increased 470% since January 2011. The number of available driving jobs has increased due to the rise in delivery jobs and the gig economy (Amazon, Uber, Lyft, DoorDash, etc.).
- The size of the total labor force is down due to the pandemic.
- The labor force participation rate is also down due to the pandemic.
- A decrease in CDL training due to the pandemic has reduced the number of new CDL drivers. As a result, the number of new drivers has not kept pace with the number of drivers resigning/retiring and has caused increased competition for existing CDL drivers. CDL driver training decreased as there is no virtual/online option for obtaining CDL status due to the nature of the job.
- Lack of childcare / in-person schooling due to COVID-19, leading to more employees choosing to stay home
- Unemployment compensation changes

- Fear of re-entering the workforce due to COVID-19
- Local legalization of marijuana making it more difficult to pass CDL required new hire and random drug testing

Based upon labor shortages, it is necessary for RTC to consider implementing temporary service changes to be able to provide consistent service for its customers. The next service changes are scheduled for January 1, 2022, and may include the following items:

b. Routine Schedule Time Adjustments - As part of RTC's on-going effort to provide reliable and on-time service, staff monitors bus travel times and speeds, as well as other statistics. As traffic patterns change, passenger habits change, and street networks change, these an effect on the reliability and on-time performance of each route. Therefore, each service change contains small adjustments to the schedule timetables to maintain their relevance to what the bus can actually perform, thereby improving reliability and on-time performance, as well as customer service. This service change will contain these small adjustments to a small group of routes.
