1. ROLL CALL/CALL TO ORDER

The Citizens Multimodal Advisory Committee (CMAC) meeting was conducted as a Zoom Meeting. The meeting was called to order at 5:30 p.m. by Xuan Wang.

2. VERBAL INSTRUCTIONS REQUIRED BY ASSEMBLY BILL 219 (2023)

RTC staff read the instructions required of participating via Zoom and participating via telephone.

3. PUBLIC COMMENT

Sue-Ting Chene volunteered to be Chair and Ryan Bernadette volunteered to be Vice Chair for the term August 7, 2024, until June 30, 2025.

Damien Cole made a motion to approve the election of Chair and Vice Chair to serve from August 7, 2024, until June 30, 2025.

Paul Hewen seconded.

The motion carried unanimously.

6. INFORMATION AND DISCUSSION ITEMS.

ITEM 1: Provide information and advice regarding the construction, installation and maintenance of benches, shelters and transit stops for RTC passengers.

Sai Sun, RTC Transit Planner, gave a presentation on the construction, installation and maintenance of benches, shelters and transit stops for RTC passengers. A copy of the presentation is on file at the RTC Metropolitan Planning Department.

Damien asked why the City of Reno allowed J Entertainment to add landscape that caused the bus stop to be removed at 4th and Ralston on route 11. Alex Cruz, RTC Senior Planner, and Sai will meet with City of Reno and developers to see why the appropriate channels were not followed and the possibility of re-adding the bus stop to that location.

Michael Gawthrop-Hutchins asked if bollards or barriers will be considered to prevent a pedestrian being hit by a vehicle while waiting at a stop near a high-speed road. Sai replied this is something that will be investigated.

Panah asked if Google Maps know where the bus is located. Alex responded that there is an approximate 15-30 second delay but the bus positioning should be working correctly. There was a discussion regarding accessibility and ease of use with the transit app. Alex will look at accessibility options for blind users to access real-time bus arrival information.

ITEM 2: Receive a presentation on the Active Transportation Plan.

Marquis Williams, RTC Senior Technical Planner, gave a presentation on the Active Transportation Plan (ATP). A copy of the presentation is on file at the RTC Metropolitan Planning Department.

Damien asked how to become a part of the Active Transportation technical working group. Marquis responded that the technical working group will be a staff or agency specific group. The most involved way to participate is to be part of the neighborhood coalitions which is open to the public.

Sue-Ting asked the best way to find information about the ATP. Marquis stated RTC is in the process of finding a consultant to develop an outreach plan for this program. Information currently can be found at <u>https://rtcwashoe.com/planning/active-transportation-plan/</u>. Panah encouraged outreach go out to renters, social media, multilingual networks, flyers be made, libraries, bus ads, homeowner's associations and the Chamber of Commerce.

Panah asked if traffic data was taken into consideration to reduce single occupancy vehicle trips. Marquis responded although traffic data was not included in the metrics of this plan, it is acknowledged that this is a way to reduce congestion. Panah asked that gaps like sidewalks and bike racks be added in large shopping areas that present an impediment to non-car users. She also stated focus is needed for those gaps where land ownership and jurisdiction pose an obstacle.

Provide information, advice, and recommendations regarding the proposed Amendment No. 4 to the FFY 2023-2027 Regional Transportation Improvement Program (RTIP).

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

Amendment No. 4 is required to facilitate the Nevada Department of Transportation's (NDOT) Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) adoption, which includes updates to projects in the RTIP. The amendment includes the removal of completed projects and the addition of new projects, as well as updates to others.

A separate air quality analysis for the proposed amendment was not required as the added and amended projects are either exempt from transportation conformity requirements or have already complied with this requirement and the associated amendment does not involve a change to the project scope. However, an air quality analysis was recently conducted as part of an amendment to the Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) for the project involving operational and capacity improvements to I-80 between Vista Boulevard and USA Parkway. The project was shown to be in conformance with federal air quality regulations and the associated changes are included within this amendment to the RTIP.

A complete list of the projects meeting the amendment threshold and thus requiring formal action, as well as a brief description of the changes to each project, are as follows:

- US 395, North Valleys, Golden Valley to Stead, Phase 2 amendment to project that increases funding to reflect updated budget and scope; combined with construction phase of another project
- G-751 Bridge Replacement project newly added to RTIP; project to replace structure and rebuild roadway approaches on bridge in Lockwood
- I-80 East, WAWidening amendment to project that adds funding for the construction phase and increases total project cost
- FRWA51, Enhanced Safety Improvements amendment to project that increases total project cost and moves construction back one year
- I-580 Bowers to Mount Rose Highway Preservation amendment to project that increases total project cost and moves construction back one year

- I-80, Verdi Bridge Replacements Phase 1 new project to replace multiple bridge structures in the Verdi area
- SR667, Kietzke Lane, from South Virginia Street to Plumb Lane; SR653, Plumb Lane, from Kietzke Lane to Terminal Way new project to conduct pavement preservation activities on intersecting road segments in Reno

The public comment period for the amendment began on Wednesday, August 28, 2024, and will close on Tuesday, September 17, 2024. A public hearing will be held at the RTC Board meeting on Friday, September 20, 2024.
