The Technical Advisory Committee meeting was conducted as a Zoom meeting. Mariam Ahmad, Chair, called the meeting to order at 9:03 a.m.

ITEM 6. RECEIVED A PRESENTATION ON THE DRAFT COORDINATED PUBLIC TRANSIT-HUMAN SERVICES TRANSPORTATION PLAN (CTP)

Graham Dollarhide, RTC Planning Manager, gave a presentation on the draft Coordinated Public Transit-Human Services Transportation Plan (CTP).

Scott Carey with City of Sparks asked about the 5310 Grant funding and about diverting the funds. Graham Dollarhide, RTC Planning Manager clarified that the annual estimate for the FTA funding is 625,000 which RTC contributes a similar amount for the equivalent to the program.

Candace Stowell stated the stakeholder survey is outdated and to please update. She asked about the eligibility of capital improvement projects, such as bus purchases and bus stop improvements, under the coordinated plan. Graham Dollarhide, RTC Planning Manager confirmed that operating and capital projects are eligible. He stated the bus stop improvements would be considered through the short-range transit plan, the Transit Optimization Plan Strategies (TOPS).

ITEM 7. MEMBER ITEMS – DEVELOPMENT UPDATES AND OTHER UPDATES

Scott Carey from the City of Sparks reported on three significant development projects: the modernization of Reed High School, the Marina Village development, and the D'Andrea Plan Development Handbook amendment for freestanding signs.

Chris Tolley discussed the 2024 update to the Truckee Meadows Regional Plan and the upcoming Truckee Meadows Annual Report, he gave the website for review: https://tmrpa.org/rpgb-meetings-2024/

Kyle Chisholm discussed the closure of Stead Elementary School with a new Stead Elementary School relocation, the progress of Vaughn Elementary School and a ribbon cutting for the Debbie Smith Career Technical Academy.

Candace Stowell announced the award of 1.6 million in coordinated tribal assistance funds for a new multi-purpose justice center with more updates coming in 2025.

RECOMMENDED ACTION

Receive a presentation on the 2050 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) Update

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

The RTP is the RTC's long-range transportation plan as required under Title 23, Part 450 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). It contains major transportation projects and programs for Washoe County for all modes of travel. It functions as the major tool for implementing regional long-range transportation planning. The RTP captures the community's vision of the transportation system and identifies the projects, programs, and services necessary to achieve that vision.

The RTC initiated the development of the 2050 Regional Transportation Plan Update in the Fall of 2023. The planning process identifies long-term goals for the regional transportation system and identifies the projects, programs, and services that are expected to be implemented through 2050. The RTP is based on a robust community engagement process and conducted in collaboration with partner agencies. The RTP is required to address at least a 20-year planning timeframe and must include short and long-term strategies to foster the development of an integrated multi-modal regional transportation system that facilitates the safe and efficient movement of people and goods. Additional requirements of the RTP include a prioritized and fiscally constrained list of the transportation projects and services for the region that are needed over the next 20 years. Federal regulations require that the RTP be updated every four years. The current RTP approval extends through March 2025. The draft plan will be available for public and agency review in January 2025, with Board action by February 2025.
