Military Road is an important corridor in our community, carrying more than 15,000 vehicles each day. As our region continues to grow, this project is designed to improve how people travel through the area safely and efficiently, whether driving, walking, biking, or rolling.

This project will widen Military Road from two lanes to four lanes between Lemmon Drive and Lear Boulevard, while also adding new sidewalks, a shared-use path, upgraded intersections, and improved drainage systems. Construction is anticipated to begin in June 2026 and be completed in the fall of 2027.

Military Road Capacity & Safety Project

Project Overview

Military Road is a key corridor in the North Valleys, serving more than 15,000 vehicles daily. This project will improve safety, increase capacity, and enhance access for all users.

Project Limits: Lemmon Drive to Lear Boulevard

Timeline: June 2026 – Fall 2027

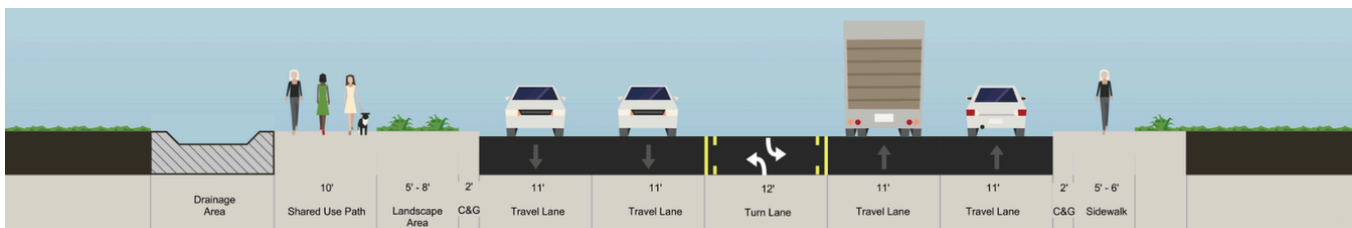
Investment: Approximately \$35 million (funded by Regional Road Impact Fees)

What's Changing

- Expanding from 2 lanes to 4 lanes
- Adding a shared-use path and sidewalks
- Installing new traffic signals at key intersections
- Improving drainage systems
- Enhancing lighting and pedestrian crossings

Project Benefits

- Improved traffic flow and reduced congestion
- Safer intersections and roadway conditions
- Better connectivity for pedestrians, bicyclists, and scooters
- Reduced flooding and improved drainage performance



Construction Overview

Construction will begin in June 2026 and take place in phases until completion in fall 2027.

Work Includes:

- Underground utilities and storm drain installation
- Sidewalk, curb, and shared-use path construction
- Final roadway paving and widening (2027)

Traffic Impacts:

- One lane in each direction will remain open
- Access to homes and businesses will be maintained
- Temporary detours may occur on side streets

Working Hours:

- Monday through Friday, 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.
- Weekend work as needed with advance notice

Frequently Asked Questions

1. Why is this project needed?

Military Road currently carries over 15,000 vehicles per day and is expected to see continued growth. This project improves safety, reduces congestion, and provides better access for all users.

2. What improvements are being made?

The project will widen the road from two lanes to four lanes, add a shared-use path and sidewalks, install new traffic signals, improve intersections, and upgrade drainage infrastructure.

3. When will construction start and finish?

Construction is anticipated to begin in June 2026 and be completed in fall 2027.

4. Will traffic be impacted during construction?

Yes, but at least one lane in each direction will remain open. Drivers may experience delays, and temporary detours may be in place for side streets.

5. Will I still be able to access my home or business?

Yes. Access will be maintained throughout construction, although routes may shift at times.

6. What are the construction hours?

Regular work hours are Monday through Friday from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., with occasional weekend work as needed.

7. How will this project improve safety?

The project includes safer intersections with new signals, improved lighting, better pedestrian crossings, and a separated shared-use path for people walking and biking.

8. How is the project funded?

The approximately \$35 million project is funded through Regional Road Impact Fees, which are paid by developers to support infrastructure improvements.

9. How can I stay informed during construction?
